We are delighted with the many positive comments from Alumni, friends, priests, and even principals and teachers of other schools about our newsletter, "The Perpetual Light". Your interest, letters, emails, and visits, encourage us to keep the spirit of the "OLPH Saints" alive and reminds us of the importance our school plays in the Daly City community and in the continuing life of the Church in the Bay Area.

On January 27, we held our open house for Alumni and prospective new parents. As always, a new group of alums returned to the "top of the hill" for the first time since they graduated (one from the class of '49!). Today, our Alumni list is just short of 1000 names, about 1/3 of all the students who have graduated since 1935. We are always happy to meet returning alums at any time, even during school hours. If you ring our main door buzzer, someone is usually available to give you a school tour, show you the church and/or the beautiful new Marian Shrine between the rectory and church.

This issue of the newsletter lists the names of many benefactors who have generously donated to our school scholarship and building campaign over the past 2 years. Alumni account for the lion's share of donations to our school. Development Director, Ed Mahoney, reports that over \$70,000 has been received towards our \$90,000 goal for renovation of Alumni Hall (cafeteria), including floor, lighting, window and stage updating. Most of this comes from our two Auction dinners and from Alumni contributions. The Lorraine Mahoney Scholarship Fund has over \$13,000 in contributions for deceased loved ones. Grants and Foundations solicited by two of our teachers, Mary Lucett and Sheila Ortega, have provided us with over \$25,000, enough to purchase over 30 iBook lap tops and two mobile computer carts. Over the years, your contributions helped us keep tuition rates at the current \$3,500 per year, the lowest in San Mateo County and one of the lowest in the Archdiocese.

We have much to be thankful for here at OLPH. We especially acknowledge Ed Mahoney for his efforts in organizing the Alumni and his hard work in publishing our newsletter. We are thankful to our wonderful staff, as well as our parents and parishioners who go the extra mile for our school. With your continued interest and support, Our Lady of Perpetual Help School will continue to be a healthy and viable educational alternative in the local community.

Nadine (Mignault '63) Goyhenetche receives USF distinction

OLPH graduate Nadine Goyhenetche was honored in May, 2006 by the University of San Francisco along with a number of other former USF students who made contributions to USF's "Legacy of Service" to others during the University's 150 years of existence. Nadine was selected for serving in the Peace Corps from 1971 to 1973.

"I was the first and only volunteer in Kolila, a small village in Liberia, West Africa. I taught fourth, fifth and sixth grades which totaled about 20 students. Their ages ranged from 10 years to older than I was at that time (22). Most children had to work on their families' rice farms and couldn't go to school (which they very much wanted to do!!!). My students loved books, but books were scarce in African villages. I taught them about libraries, something they'd never heard of, and worked on setting up a small one for them before I left. There were many book contributions mailed from back home to fill the library!"

Nadine is now a Psychiatric Rehabilitation Practitioner, which she feels is very much like her work in the Peace Corps. "In both, I'm challenged to 'change the world' a little bit at a time by being welcoming and respectful to everyone I meet each day, whether they're from another part of the world or dealing with mental health issues."

She feels fortunate to have the opportunity in her profession to bring together mental health and AOD (alcohol and other drugs) services in San Mateo County--so clients with multi-needs ("And aren't we all multi-needy?" she says) are listened to by ALL providers, rather than being referred to the 'other' service!

Nadine has wonderful memories of her years at OLPH. Her sister, Janine, graduated in 1970 and her parents, Walter (Walt) and Lorraine were extremely active in the church and school. Mrs. Mignault served as OLPH Mothers' Club President from 1961-62.

When an OLPH classmate was given the 'future prediction', of being an 'interpreter of the Basque language', Nadine remembers asking her Mother what "Basque" was, little knowing that she would eventually marry a Basque man, her husband, Gracian. Together, the couple has been commissioned to compile a 25th Anniversary book for the Basque Cultural Center (599 Railroad Avenue in South San Francisco).

This tremendous task, coupled with her son's wedding in October of 2007 and her mental health work, leaves Nadine with little 'free' time these days. Still, she has volunteered to return to her Alma Mater and give slide show presentations ("I have 1500 slides of North and West Africa!!!") for the pleasure and edification of current OLPH students.

Congratulations, Nadine, for all of your accomplishments and for your continued dedication and hard work. Our Lady of Perpetual Help School is very fortunate to have you as an Alumna!

Notes from past grads...

SISTER RITA MARIE KROPP writes from the Sisters of St. Joseph Mother House in Orange, CA: "I would love to be able to attend the Open House and March dinner, but I'm not able to travel alone. OLPH has always had a special place in my prayers and in my heart." The beloved Sr. Rita taught at OLPH from 1939 to 1943, then returned as a teaching principal from 1960 through 1966.

1942 WILLIAM NASSANO passed away in December after a long career working in the sheet metal business. Bill lived in Daly City all his life and was the son of Isabel Kettler who, along with her husband Carl, owned and managed the Relish Bakery on Mission Street, across from McGraw's Drug Store, at the Top of the Hill.

Pat sent in copies of her "priceless" black-and-white photos of her days at OLPH in the 1950's to the Development Department recently. 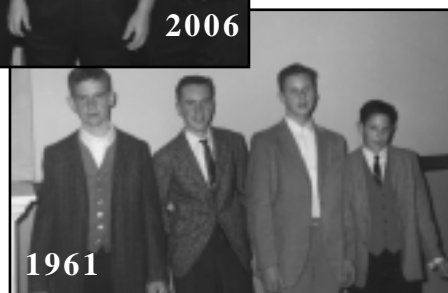

DONATING APPRECIATED STOCK

Those of you who own stock that has gone up in value over the years can maximize the tax benefit of a donation to OLPH by making a gift of the stock rather than cash. According to IRS rules, the value of a gift of stock for charitable donation purposes is the value at the time the gift is made.

So, if you bought a share of XYZ stock some time ago for \$50, but it has doubled in value since then, if you donate the stock to OLPH, you are entitled to a deduction of \$100. And, here is the sweetener: you will not owe capital gains taxes on the increase in value. If you sold the stock and gave the \$100 to OLPH in cash, you would owe tax on the gain you made by selling the stock for more than you paid for it. When you donate the stock itself, there is no capital gains tax. The IRS wants to encourage donations to worthy institutions like OLPH, so it has provided this special break for donors. It applies to any property that has appreciated in value: stocks, mutual fund shares, real estate, etc.

If you are interested in making such a gift, Ed Mahoney can guide you through the easy process and provide you with a simple form letter you can send your broker to have the stock transferred from your account to the school's.
