A Matter of Principal By Bill Kovacich



Educators are often accused of being obsessed with questions and answers. What came first, the chicken or the egg? I once read that the chicken came first because God would have looked mighty silly sitting on an egg. Here's another question—Does the pastor of a parish pick the principal or does the principal pick the pastor? The answer to this one probably depends upon whether you ask a pastor or a principal.

In my thirty-five years as principal, I have worked with six pastors. I must admit that most of them picked me. Honestly, I have been very lucky in that I enjoyed my associations and have learned something from every pastor with whom I have worked. I like to think I picked Fr. Petilla because if I did, it was the smartest business decision I ever made. In my eight years of working with Fr. Petilla, not one day did I ever regret coming to OLPH.

The job of a pastor, like that of a principal, is filled with both challenges and rewards. In the heat of battle, it is easy to blame each other when things go wrong. With Father Petilla, this never happened. Father always collaborated with me on the challenges and the tough decisions; he always shared the rewards with the staff, the parents, with all of us. Don't get me wrong; I always knew Father was in charge. But with Fr. Petilla, I always felt respected; I always felt I had my say. I never felt undermined, belittled or back-doored. I felt like we were teammates.

Are you aware that many pastors feel that schools are a burden on a parish? Father not only tolerated children, he loved them. He often referred to the school in Sunday liturgies with fondness. He made the school an important part of the parish. To the students, he was more than a figurehead and maintained a visible presence. He presented a thoughtful, peaceful and serene demeanor. In his quiet way, he commanded a powerful respect with everyone he met.

Because of his ability to work with parish council, with parishioners, benefactors and school personnel, he leaves behind a beautiful shrine to our Mother, Mary. Despite budgetary restraints, his expertise and collaborative skills helped spearhead the historical reconstruction of our parish church. In a subtle way, his work with the superintendent of schools and the school finance board led to a significant increase in next year's school population.

Fr. Petilla leaves OLPH a champion! He fought his way to the top like Manny Pacquiao. Unlike Pacquiao, he did it without aggressiveness. He did it with hard work, love and prayer. Like all champions we are sorry to see him go. But if we truly believe in what Father stands for and has accomplished, we will take what we have learned from him and carry it forward. With our new pastor, Fr. Augusto Villotte, we will work peacefully, prayerfully and with love to carry on the legacy of our own world champion, Fr. Antonio Petilla.

FATHER PETILLA RETIRES AFTER 50 YEARS

Born on June 11, 1935 in Calbayog City, Samar, Phillipines Father attended high school and college in the Phillipines (Seminario de San Carlos, Cebu City), culminating with his ordination to the priesthood on March 18, 1961. His early assignments from 1961 through 1987 were in various capacities in Northern and Western Samar in the Phillipines, including a stint as Diocesan Economus, a member of the Diocesan Board of Consultors and Vicar Forane from 1978-1984. From 1982-1984, Father served as Episcopal Vicar--Vicar General.

Father Petilla's first assignment in the U.S. was as Parish Vicar at St. James Parish in San Francisco, followed by posts as Vicar at Our Lady of Mercy and Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Daly City. He served his

initial Pastorship at St. Kevin's in S. F. from 1998-2002, followed by his assignment as Pastor at OLPH from 2002 until the summer of 2011. He also served as Dean of Deanery 8 for the Archdiocesan Council of Priests from 2002-2008.

From the program for Father Petilla's Golden Sacerdotal Jubilee/retirement celebration on June 11, 2011, in his own words: "Lord, I have answered your call and you have chosen me despite my unworthiness. And through the impulse of your goodness you have raised me to the dignity of the Holy Priesthood, to be a bridge-builder between you and your people. In the 50th year of my Priesthood, filled with joy, love and gratitude, I thank you for this singular gift and privilege that I have received from your great generosity! Amen."

THE NAVE, THE ARCADE AND THE VESTIBULE OF THE "NEW" OLPH CHURCH

The entire flooring of OLPH Church, including the ramp from the main entrance, the arcade and the vestibule is fitted with Saltillo tiles, in keeping with the theme of Mission Revival. Before they could be laid, the tiles had to be scrubbed, washed, cleaned, polished and stained. This is where the "bayanihan" spirit of the parish community played a big role. Dozens of parishioners, led by the tireless Fr. Dennis Barlaan, gave their time and effort in this laborious task. In the end, they got no material reward, just the personal satisfaction that their hands, though unseen, are imprinted in those tiles that are so carefully tread upon and admired.



The original oak pews were refinished and their glistening new glaze is the only sparkle in the otherwise overall subdued atmosphere.

Next to the sanctuary, the nave received the most decorative and ornamental changes. The restored and beautifully refinished mosaic of the Our Lady of Perpetual Help icon from the old wall shrine now prominently occupies a niche with the saints along the side. The 14 original Czech stations of the cross paintings (donated by Italian and Irish parishioners of yore) were reframed with hand-carved and gold-leafed frames. Beneath each painting are hand-forged wrought iron sconces, Fleur-De-Lys-designed, symbolizing the purity of the Virgin Mary, the three leaves the symbol of the Holy Trinity.

The first-time visitor to the new OLPH will be reminded of the mission churches lining California from San Diego to San Rafael. To the long-time parishioner, however, it is a coming home to a familiar place of worship and contemplation, but one now more welcoming, more embracing, as Pastor Antonio Petilla wished and willed it to be.

Dolores Rodriguez '52 Recounts History of OLPH Statue



My parents, Alfred & Clotilda Rodriguez lived in Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish from 1932 - 1959 when they moved to Burlingame and became parishioners of Our Lady of Angels.

Both Mom and Dad participated in parish events at OLPH. Dad would help with the set up of booths for the church bazaars. Mom would work in the "Sewing Club" booth selling the wares the Ladies Sewing Group made throughout the year. They were both willing to get involved wherever the parish needed them. Mom enjoyed helping out Fr. Bergin, Fr. Stewart and later Fr. Norman Allen. She was an active member of the Altar Society. The Sisters of St. Joseph (CSJO) were extended family. Whatever the sisters needed, if they mentioned it to Mom, somehow it would get done. After the new school building was dedicated, the Sisters discussed the possibility of a statue of OLPH. Mom quietly set about the how, where and cost of such a purchase. In downtown SF there was a large well-known religious supply store. One could find and order anything needed for personal or liturgical use. The approximate four-foot statue of OLPH was found and ordered. The beautiful statue was dedicated and placed on a pedestal outside the principal's office on the 2nd floor.

Dolores Rodriguez and Sr. Philomene When I visited OLPH for the Open House on Jan. 29, 2011, upon entry into the lower hall it was such a surprise and joy to see the original statue right in front of me. I had thought the statue would have fallen during one of the earthquakes, particularly Loma Prieta. The statue on the 2nd floor was not secured to the wall; as a child I had been told that there were no statues in the church because it had been built in a fault-sensitive area. So to see this beautiful statue welcoming those who entered the school and auditorium was such a warm and heartfelt experience. Mom & Dad would be pleased to know it is still standing.



MEMORIES OF THE HILL

Boy, let me tell you something; being a journalist is no easy task. Just write an article and then attend the annual fund raiser and find out how many mistakes you made and things you left out.

The March 5th dinner featured the class of 1961. What a turnout for their class, good to see old friends once again. However, I was bombarded for leaving the man who whipped up the ice cream at the Relish bakery out of my last article. I apologize! Old age is hell! The gentleman I am referring to was **Rip Harrison**, **Father of Tim '61 (R.I.P.)**, **Kathy '64 and David '75.** He taught me everything about making ice cream.

Cocky as I was, I sent three samples to the California State Fair in Sacramento. The year 1962; I sent a sample of vanilla and received a blue ribbon. Then I sent in a batch of Rocky Road and get a letter back stating that the marshmallows were stale and the walnuts were rancid. Sheesh!!! Everyone who tried that batch thought it was the best Rocky Road they ever tasted. Anyway, when summer came around teenagers were always looking for jobs. The Relish Bakery always needed pot washers, pan greasers, people to roll dough etc. Several alumni from way back worked there: Ben Peralta '50,Art Garcia '55, Bill

Nassano '42, Felix Valdez '54, Ron Brugioni '55, to name a few.

Another establishment that had become a fixture at the Top of the Hill was Shannon's Hardware. Unlike the Big Box stores of today, this was a "Mom and Pop" operation where if you wanted 6 nails you weighed them on a scale and paid for what you needed. You didn't have to buy a whole box. Wooden floors and bins full of nuts, bolts and screws of every size. Upstairs was for the older kids--the Daly City Pool Hall. They made terrific hamburgers and hot dogs and many of Daly City's finest hung out there, cigarettes rolled up in their t-shirt sleeves, hair greased back with Vaseline. Then at the corner of the block was Duffy's Tavern. We were too young to go inside, but the aroma of beer and whiskey permeated my nasal passages when I passed by the front door. By the time I was old enough to be a patron there I had already joined the Navy. When I got back from duty, Duffy's was torn down as part of the widening of Knowles Avenue into John Daly Blvd.
